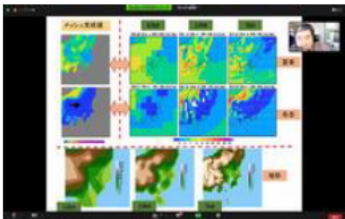

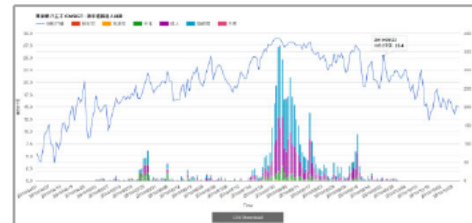

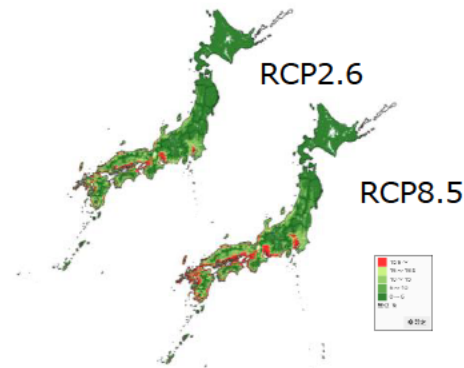

Tasks of climate adaptation managers

As part of the Federal Environment Ministry's (BMUV) emergency climate adaptation program, Federal Environment Minister Steffi Lemke has announced funding for 100 climate adaptation managers in municipalities. These staff positions are funded through the BMUV program “Measures to adapt to the consequences of climate change”. The task of the climate adaptation managers is to coordinate the creation of a climate adaptation concept for the municipality and within the municipality and to implement this concept. This is intended to anchor climate adaptation in the community in a sustainable and strategically sensible manner. The adaptation managers are hired by the municipalities. Within a certain framework, which is set by
